




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Andriy Telibayev Photographic Artist. Member of the National Society of Photo Artists of Ukraine (NSPAU)

Born in Lviv, Ukraine. His journey into photography began in his school years through local photo clubs and early participation in youth photography competitions. His first cameras were the legendary Agat-18 and Zenit TTL. After a pause due to studying abroad, his passion for photography was revived in 2003 — through master classes, workshops, and photo tours. He works across several genres, including landscape, abstraction, portraiture, and nude.

Andriy is a participant in numerous solo and group exhibitions in Ukraine and abroad. His works have been featured in international contests (including

FIAP circuits), selected for exhibition catalogs, and published in leading international magazines such as Pixel, Monochrom, Darkly Artmagazine, Photohouse Magazine, UAmodels, and others.

Artist Bindhi Rajagopal's works showcase the ecological importance of mangroves

Bindhi Rajagopal's show, The Grounded Guardians: A Meditation on Mangrove Roots, explores how mangroves nurture and preserve life

Shades of mossy green, dominate artist Bindhi Rajagopal's latest show, The Grounded Guardians: A Meditation on Mangrove Roots, on at the Durbar Hall Art Gallery. The latest show is an ode to mangroves which form a green wall around the city where it meets the backwaters. Mangroves hold the earth, they prevent natural calamities and they nurture life like a mother would, hence, Bindhi says, she has used them as a recurring motif in the works

"This is my first solo show in a long time. First came the 2018 floods, then COVID-19... one thing after the other kept happening. The works on show are those that I worked on over this period. These are not all, just some," she adds, laughing.

Intertwining mangrove roots border some of the works, footprints forming the background for a couple of her latest works. The past impacts the future as much as the present. Bindhi seems to suggest that we have to be careful about what we leave behind for future generations.

"I attended a workshop by a scientist on the role mangroves play in preserving ecology, and that got me curious about them. The idea embedded itself in my mind," Bindhi explains why she chose mangroves.

Some of the works have a woman with cats, while others have fish and algae-like life forms, all of which seem to draw sustenance from each other. The paintings reveal symbiotic relationship with nature and all its creatures, mankind included. "I am trying to say through my works how our actions impact all creation, and how we should be responsible."

Bindhi, an alumnus of RLV College of Music and Fine Arts, has been practising her craft for close to three decades. She held her first show in 1992 followed by







one in 1998. Over the years she has been part of solo and group shows in Kerala and abroad and has also curated art shows. She has been an art teacher in a school and later, an assistant professor of visual arts in a college.

She uses visual metaphors and symbolism to get her point across. For instance, one of her paintings done during COVID-19 is actually three - a triptych, which shows three women on three different canvases. All three wear masks, and despite being together they cannot inhabit the same space. The isolation is unmissable. "Isn't that how we felt during the pandemic? My daughters felt it intensely, not being able to step out or meet friends. That was all of us. The painting is the three of us or it could be anybody!"

The artist is preoccupied with the past, present and future, and how one impacts the other. The works on show bear testimony to it.



B. A. Sudath Abeysekara Thalawathugoda, Sri Lanka


Sudath Abeysekara is one of Sri Lanka's senior artists whose journey in printmaking is rooted in traditional woodcut and etching techniques. His artistic practice has evolved into a critical, thought-provoking exploration of political and social issues. Through works such as "225 Cross" and "Crows Done and Dusted", he presents a bold critique of Sri Lanka's political system, using powerful symbolism and visual metaphors.

He frequently uses symbols such as crows, thorns, and crosses to express social resistance, fear, and tension. His work invites viewers into a space of confrontation and reflection, offering new insights into the socio-political realities of Sri Lanka.

In 2023, he took part in a residency at the Guanlan Original Printmaking Base in China, gaining valuable international experience that further expanded his creative vision and printmaking techniques.

A major milestone in his career was the creation of Sri Lanka's first large-format printmaking machine—an idea initiated by Abeysekara himself and realized in collaboration with a Sri Lankan machinery manufacturing company. This machine enabled the production of large-scale woodcut prints and marked a turning point in the country's printmaking landscape.

The machine was used for the first time in his most recent exhibition, held on March 21, 2025. This groundbreaking exhibition was one of the first in Sri Lanka dedicated entirely to woodcut and etching works. Through large-scale



politically themed prints, he challenged the audience to engage with current realities and open new spaces for critical dialogue.

Across all these projects, Sudath Abeysekara demonstrates how art can become a platform for conversation, resistance, and the reimagining of social and political consciousness.






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Ormira Lulanaj Albania





She has spent years refining her skills, experimenting with various techniques and materials, primarily works with oil, creating artworks in abstract and general realistic styles. In 2023, she expanded her expertise by completing a contemporary art course at Christie's education.

Since February 2021, Victoria has been conducting her own unique worldwide project called art-tour-show "Artifact". 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

Biography of Dr. Emelie Victor Anyaegbunam

Dr. Emelie Victor Anyaegbunam is a distinguished Nigerian visual artist whose works traverse the boundaries of monochromatic expression and cultural storytelling. Born in Port Harcourt and based in Lagos, he has cultivated a unique artistic voice rooted in Afrocentric identity, emotional depth, and visual rhythm. His academic journey through the Institute of Management and Technology, Enugu, and Lagos State Polytechnic, Ikorodu, shaped his formal foundation, while life experiences honed his expressive force.

Working primarily in oil, acrylic, pastel, watercolor, and charcoal, Emelie's oeuvre stands out for its deliberate restraint in color—anchored in blacks, whites, and greys—while infusing symbolic touches of gold and green. These elements, sparked by a spontaneous gold paint spill on an ink drawing, have evolved into visual metaphors of African wealth, vitality, and remembrance.

He is the founder and creative director of Okomoko Art Gallery in Lekki, and a full-time studio artist whose work has gained global recognition. Emelie has exhibited across Africa, Asia, Europe, and the Americas, earning numerous international accolades and serving as a cultural ambassador through respected art organizations.







Acclaimed artist Christiaan Diedericks (BSc, BA(FA), MA(FA) aims to 're-write' history and the dominant sense of self-awareness that informs most Western art practices and presents contemporary issues such as Difference as timeless, by situating his vocabulary of images and themes in an organic flux of dreams, history, news, commercial detritus, hyper-reality, and unvoiced feelings and forces of biological nature/desire. To name only a few, Christiaan received numerous international awards such as the Doctor Raya Mayo Award (AU\$8000) at InkFest, 5th InkMasters Biennial 2021 and he won an International Spiritual Award on two different occasions. Diedericks has mounted more than 50 both national and international solo exhibitions to date. He also travels extensively and completed more than 40 international artist's residencies since 1992 after his undergrad art studies. This includes 11 residencies at the Cité International des Arts in Paris, one at the Il Bisonte International School for Printmaking in Florence, and two at both the Frans Masereel in Kasterlee in Belgium at the Guanlan International Print Base in Shenzhen, China to name just a few. The Cape Town based artist is a master printmaker who works in all traditional media, including ceramics and bronze sculpture, but he is also firmly embracing new and digital media.


Nargish soma Rajshahi, Bangladesh



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
The year was 1952, when Gloria Keh was born in the Chinese Year of The Dragon.

Her late father, Martin Fu, was an oil painter, who although never achieved fame, and died poor, enjoyed many rich experiences from his art and his love of classical music and European opera. Gloria was blessed to grow up in a household surrounded by art and music. Not only did her father paint a great deal, but her late elder brother had a passion for making watercolor paintings which were always of very serious looking Catholic saints. And mother would spend her leisure time coloring black and white comic books. But art is art, no matter what the subject may have been.

Because it was a difficult task making a living as an oil painter, her late father was forced to work in an advertising agency, as a commercial artist, in order to support his family. Gloria would also hang around her father, either in his office, or when he freelanced, working on graphic art, at home. She enjoyed watching him work, making art... Hence, she was exposed to commercial art and graphics from a very impressionable age. In addition, to subsidise her allowance, Gloria began peddling little artworks drawn and painted in poster colors, even before she was 10. She would sell her little drawings/paintings for \$3 a pop, indeed a princely sum in those days for a child.

However, with the passage of time, Gloria entered the work force, taking on jobs in other fields of employment, that certainly afforded better monetary rewards than art. Sadly, art was to take a back seat for a long time, until 1996, when in Melbourne, Gloria began serious study in mandala art and symbolism. Her teacher, Georgina Fode of the Theosophical Society, played an important role in her development as an artist. Her study in mandala art and symbolism continued for a decade, following which, upon the blessings and request of her mandala teacher, Gloria began facilitating mandala workshops both in Melbourne and Singapore. She also undertook a short study course in art therapy. Although she attributes her first art teacher to be her late father, Gloria studied oil painting under P. Gnana of Gnani Arts in Singapore. And acrylic painting under the watchful eye of her mentor, Gregory Burns.

Says Gloria: "As I age, I prefer the comforts and quiet of solitude. Painting provides me with a form of meditation, and I find inner peace and healing through my art."

In this sense, my art becomes a voice for those who cannot always express themselves openly.

Painting with acrylics is particularly significant to me because of the medium's flexibility and vibrancy. Acrylic paints allow me to work in layers, experiment with textures, and achieve bold contrasts that enhance the dreamlike quality of my art. The intensity of col-

ors mirrors the intensity of emotions that I wish to communicate—anger, sorrow, resilience, and hope. Each brushstroke becomes an act of storytelling, translating the complex reality of women's lives into visual poetry.

At the heart of my practice is a deep desire to engage viewers emotionally and intellectually. I want those who experience my work to pause, reflect, and empathize with the narratives it conveys. 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
Bicycles, like all forms of transportation, represent a type of freedom. When we bring this symbol into a work of art, we are met at the intersection of our personal histories and the vast possibilities of the journeys that lay before us. The ladders around my paintings work in a similar way, and they act like "crutches" for the bicycles. They appeared in my artwork before the bicycles. A ladder is a symbol of ascension and reaching out. They lead to other platforms and perspectives. While not entirely abstract, my bicycles travel through paintings that contain a sense of musical exuberance, in fields of colors that converse across an imagined landscape. By air, by sea, by land; these bicycles are not confined to the laws of physics, but instead exist in their magical world. I always quote my father, when first teaching me to ride a bike, in telling the story of these works: "His words were, 'If you keep looking forward and remain undistracted, you will not lose your balance and fall. But if you do fall, brush yourself off and start cycling again." This determination to keep moving forward, to explore continually, is evident in my work. Furthermore, the openness of the territory expresses the freedom and enormous possibility that comes when we study the world on a bicycle.







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My works speak of faith and love for humanity. In these times, we have only tried to destroy each other and not hold each other's hands as brothers. We have only focused on egos, hatred, and money instead of worrying about what is most important: love for our brothers.

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tion — my journey through the inner storm toward light." «Taking Root» — an act of defiance and surrender in equal measure. When the ground beneath seems unstable, the only way forward is to root deeper. Heavy, earthentones and dense textures embody the search for grounding, the concentration of strength. Here, color itself becomes resolve.

Harvest — a reminder that not every harvest is easily won, yet its sweetness is incomparable. After long internal labor comes a sense of fullness, of ripened experience. Gold, ochre, terracotta radiate the warmth that arises when one truly knows the cost of endurance. Gratitude, distilled in pigment, alters the memory of struggle.

Chains — perhaps the most demanding painting of the series. It speaks of the walls we construct ourselves, of the claustrophobic sensation of entrapment, of a silent cry within a confined space. To cast this emotion onto the canvas was necessary; only then could it be transmuted.

Sprouts— they emerged almost unbidden, after Chains. Like the first ray of light after a storm. Fragile yet insistent, luminous lines break through fissures. Pale green, white, lemon yellow — these are the hues of relief, of the first breath of hope. This emotion acts as a key: transforming the lock of a prison into the doorway of freedom.

Through Thorns Encompassing more than twenty works, Through Thorns is Racovcena's map of transcendence. Each painting captures a crystallized moment of intense emotion, transformed into color and form. And she believes that in journeying with her canvases, the viewer too can experience the metamorphosis of consciousness and reality she speaks of. For color, in its essence, is the language of the soul — one that requires no words."




